# Career and Technical Education (CTE)



#### **CTE Courses**

- CTE courses are offered through the recognized <u>WI program areas</u> and must be taught by a licensed CTE teacher within the specific discipline
  - Exception: Health Science Education
- Determined by the district
- Districts can use <u>ELO tool</u> for licensing lookup
- Submit CTE course offerings using latest SCED 6 course codes for grades 9-12
- All CTE courses must have course codes with CTE flag



#### **CTE Courses**

- Knowing if a course is CTE starting 2018-19 is important because...
  - CTE courses will help DPI identify <u>CTE participants</u>
  - CTE courses will play an integral part in the automation of <u>CTE</u> <u>concentrators</u> down the road



### **CTE Concentrator Summary Record**

- District report CTE Concentrators
  - o Grades 11 and 12
    - \*Remember, once a concentrator, always a concentrator
- There are <u>no changes</u> for how districts determine concentrators for 2019-20
- What else needs to be submitted for each concentrator?
  - Single IAC code
  - Program Area(s)
  - Career cluster associated with the IAC code (NEW!)



## Other CTE Data Reporting

- Non Certified Career Education Programs (NEW! All students in grades 11 and 12)
  - Supervised occupational experience
  - Simulation
  - Internship
  - School-based enterprise
- Single parent
  - Required for all 11th and 12th grade students


#### **Dual Enrollment Data**

- Act 59 Requirement College and Career Readiness Data
- What needs to be submitted?
  - Program Name (NEW!)
- How do I know which program name to submit?
  - Determine the program name that best fits the dual enrollment course based on the definitions
  - Use the <u>Dual Enrollment chart</u> for guidance



## State Endorsed Regional Career Pathway

- Not a requirement of Act 59 but is part of capturing College and Career Readiness fully
- Not required for all districts
  - Only districts in the piloted regions of the Wisconsin Pathways project
- Districts must submit if the student is a...
  - Participant
  - Completer





## CTE and CCR



#### **Certified Career Education Programs**

- What are <u>Certified Career Education Programs</u>?
  - Programs or work based experiences where a student can earn a state OR business recognized certificate
- Examples of Certified Career Education Programs?
  - Youth Apprenticeship
  - State Co-op Education Skill Standards (DPI occupational, Youth Leadership, Employability Skills)
  - Industry Recognized Credentials (IRC)
    - State approved WTCS (Embedded, Technical, Associates)
    - State approved business and industry
    - Not state-approved



#### **Certified Career Education Programs**

- DPI has created a list of recommended course codes for workplace experiences associated to a course, which includes some certified career education programs.
- Where can I find the recommended codes?
- What do I need to know about the recommended codes?
  - Allow districts to code workplace experiences as courses for students who engage in Youth Apprenticeship, State Skill Standards Co-op, etc.
  - Marked as CTE courses
  - For these codes only, the teacher of the record for the workplace experience can be any DPI licensed teacher
  - The teacher of record should be coordinating worksite learning with the appropriate
    CTE teachers as part of the student's learning.



## **Certificated Program Status Type**

- Indicates whether the student earned certification while in the certified program
- Required for each certified career education program a student participates in no matter if the program is associated to a course or not.
- Status Types:
  - A: student met requirements of the certified program and was or is to be awarded a certificate
  - B: student is continuing in the certified program
  - C: student has left the certified program before completion
  - D: student has completed the program but did not meet the requirements for the certificate
- Expected at the end of each term



#### **Grades**

- Performance Base Conversion Type
  - Pass
  - Fail
  - Not Completed
  - Not Graded
  - Letter grade is optional
- Who needs to submit grades?
  - All public LEAs
- For what student grade levels?
  - Grades 9-12
  - All courses

### Snapshot vs. Deadline

**Snapshot:** Snapshots are pieces of data that are copied from active, dynamic tables in the DPI Data Warehouse (DW) at a specific point of time to a "permanent" location to support current and future reporting. This becomes **certified** data. This facilitates reporting from an unchanging set of attributes, providing consistent, repeatable query results unaffected by the dynamics of real-world changes and corrections.

**Deadline:** The August 2 deadline is the goal date that DPI recommends completing all 2018-19 WISEdata submission for **attendance and discipline data**. Try to wrap up as much of your 2018-19 data submission and validation resolution as possible before your SIS transitions to the 2019-20 school year. You should also continue making progress on Roster and Career Education data submission to WISEdata, though you are not expected to have that completed by August 2. This deadline is NOT a snapshot; it is to help keep you on track with submitting one year of data prior to moving on to the next school year.

\*DPI will begin data quality checks in August to prepare for the Dec. 10 snapshot.
